Introduction of IELTS

IELTS stands for International English Language Testing System. It tests the English ability of the candidates willing to go abroad to study or work there. In other words, it assesses the expressive and receptive skills of the candidates. The former include speaking and writing, and the latter that of listening and reading. This test is organized under two modules:

<u>Academic</u>	<u>General</u>
For candidates wishing to study at undergraduate or postgraduate levels	For candidates wishing to migrate to an English-speaking country such as Australia, Canada, New Zealand, UK, etc.

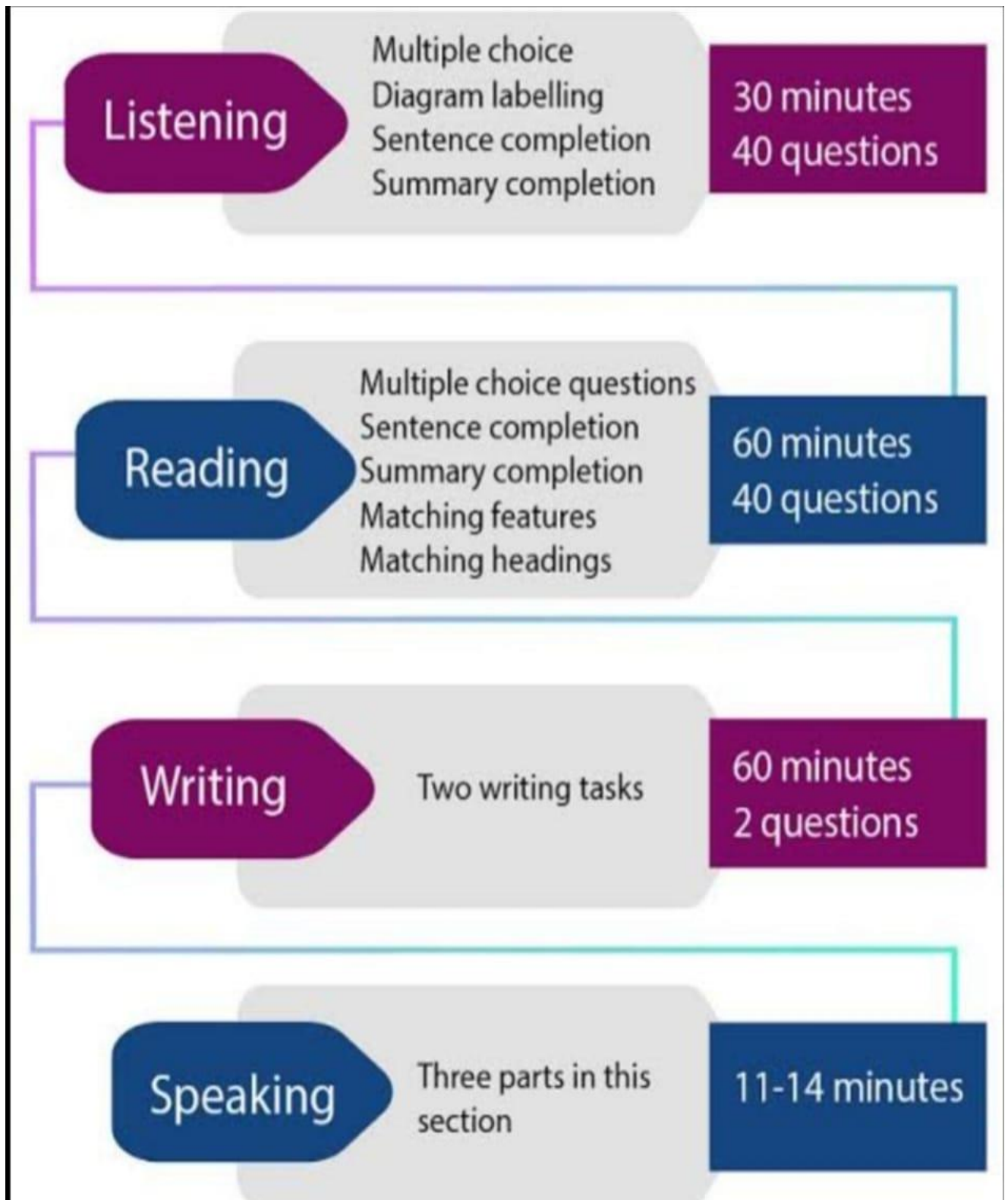
